

Proposed Bylaw Change
Springhill Parent Faculty Club
February 21st, 2007

Many of you know that the Springhill PFC owned and operated an on site daycare facility for many years. In 2004, the PFC Executive Board decided it could no longer carry the responsibility or liability of the Hide Out, and in June 2005 the Hide Out was sold to a licensed daycare operator. The bylaws of the PFC still reflect ownership of a daycare. The new language allows for a representative to be added to the board if a future PFC board decides to once again own and operate a daycare facility.

Under Article V, Executive Officers

B. Responsibilities of Officers

8. Kid's Hideout Representative

Section currently reads:

“The Hide-Out Representative shall represent the Springhill Kid's Hideout on the PFC board. Members of the Hide Out Board are considered non-voting members of the Board of Directors.”

Amended language will read:

“If the PFC owns and operates the Springhill Kid's Hide Out, or any other child care facility, the Hideout or any other child care facility so owned, shall have a representative on the PFC Board. Members of the Hide Out Board are considered non-voting members of the Board of Directors.”

The PFC Board has no power to amend the PFC bylaws. This amendment can only be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the members at a general meeting. The PFC Board will be placing this amendment on the agenda for the April 18th general meeting at 7:00 in the Springhill library.
